The Avon Free Public Library, the Avon Historical Society and the Avon Senior Center, have been selected to receive the *Revisiting the Founding Era* programming grant to explore the social & political impact of the freedom of the press and its influence in American culture. The \$1,000 grant was awarded by the American Library Association, in partnership with the Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History.

This grant will allow the Avon Free Public Library, Avon Historical Society and Avon Senior Center to offer a series of public programming events titled *Revisiting the Founding Era: Examining Freedom of the Press*, that will begin this June and continue through September 2018. Book talks, historical re-enactors, lectures, discussions, and a film series will examine the role of media & the press from the Founding Era to post-modern America. Avon High School is a supportive partner of this project, and students will be invited to attend and participate in the series.

Revisiting the Founding Era is a three-year national initiative of the Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History, presented in partnership with the American Library Association, and the National Constitution Center, with generous support from the National Endowment for the Humanities. This initiative is designed to bring libraries and their communities together to explore the continuing relevance of the Founding Era by reading, discussing, and sharing insights into the writings of Americans who experienced it firsthand.






