

Letter from the President of the Friends of Avon Public Library

September 2020

Dear Friends,

I hope you and your loved ones are safe, healthy, and able to manage during these uncertain times. To prepare for another year as president of the Friends of the Avon Public Library, I reviewed last year's newsletter messages. Seeing the notices for our Author Luncheon and our annual Book Sale made me wistful. I smiled when I saw Save the Date reminders for our yearly Birthday Bash, magicians, jugglers and other children's programming. I miss the ice cream social and those carefree, pre-pandemic days. Although things have changed dramatically in the world and in our community, I remain grateful for our library. Throughout the spring and summer our creative librarians and staff at the Avon Public Library continued to provide learning opportunities for us. From scavenger hunts to online author events, from remote book clubs to Lego Challenges, they filled our inboxes with activities and suggestions to enrich our lives. Curbside book pick-up made life easier for hungry readers, and free WIFI in the parking lot, online printing, and technical support made life better for members of the community in need. And a Zoom presentation to discover the benefits of eating dark chocolate helped assuage the guilty pleasure that's helping many of us manage the new normal.

As Friends of the Avon Public Library, we must learn how to do our work in new ways. The Board has transitioned to remote meetings and will work toward adopting remote fundraising events. Although we've postponed our author luncheon to the fall of 2021 and cancelled our traditional in-person used book sale, we are studying alternatives and planning new ways to raise much appreciated and needed funds. For example, this summer we supported the library to help purchase additional e-books for patrons who couldn't visit the library in person.




