Expansion Update

This November, the library will celebrate its twenty-fifth year in the current location. We in Avon are very fortunate to have a wonderful library with an excellent staff and a beautiful building.

The town has grown significantly in the past quarter century. So, too, has the demand for library services. The library is very busy and very crowded whenever it is open. In the past year alone, we have experienced a 3% increase in circulation. We need a larger building, with more areas designated for books, computers and other materials, more space and seating for patrons of all ages, and more rooms for meetings, programs and collaborative study. The library parking lot also is too small for current usage. The Board of Directors and staff continue to make progress in planning for the library expansion. We are very pleased that the initial planning costs were included in this year's financial plan and that Avon citizens soundly approved the town's budget.

The next step is for the Town Council to appoint a building committee which will begin the process of selecting an architect. We are looking forward to the challenges and the rewards of working on the library expansion, which is a very important project for the town and all its residents.

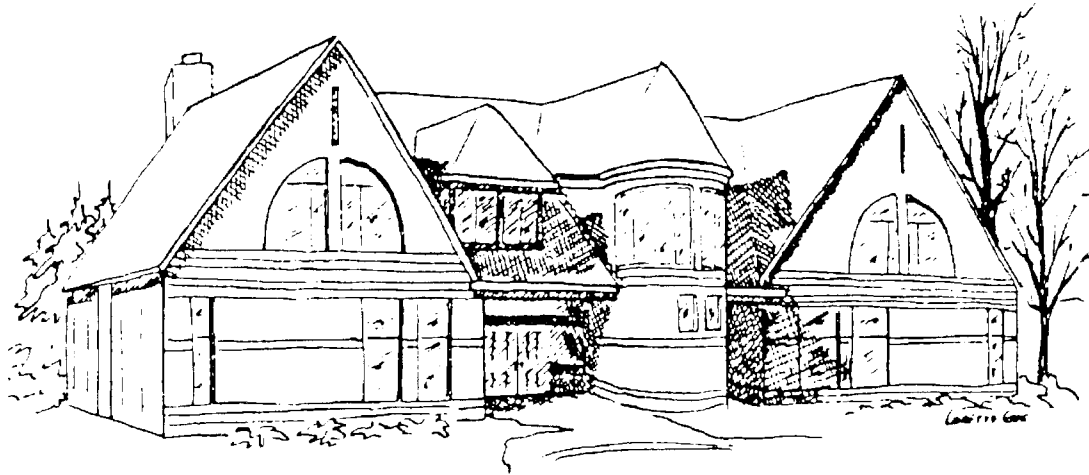
