Expansion Update

At their September meeting, The Avon Town Council voted to bring the Library's Expansion Project to referendum, setting the date for Thursday, October 22, 2009. We are excited that at long last, we can ask you to vote YES and support your public library's desperately needed expansion and renovation. The Town Manager's Office has sent out a detailed description of the project to all Avon residents. There will be a town meeting on September 21 to review the project plans and cost estimates and to answer questions from voters about the project. You may also view architectural schematics and other project information at the library or on our website.

A Political Action Committee (PAC) has been formed in order to communicate with residents about the library project and to encourage people to vote in the referendum. Herb Pandiscio, former Superintendent of Avon Schools, has graciously agreed to head the PAC, which has chosen the name Library Expansion Action Plan (LEAP). Dick Brigham, a former Library Board member and active volunteer, is the PAC's Treasurer. Many others have volunteered to serve on the LEAP committee and we are very appreciative of the contributions of all of these individuals to help assure that the referendum is a success.

After the referendum, the Board of Directors will launch a fundraising campaign to contribute toward the costs of the library expansion and renovation. We expect to draw on the talents, skills and experience of a wide range of Avon people to assist us with the fundraising and communications plans.

We are finally embarking on a long awaited vision for a larger, first-rate library which will have many attractive features and amenities for everyone in Avon. Please note the October 22 referendum on your calendar and vote YES. Thank you.

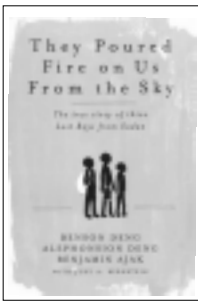

two authors of the book, *They Poured Fire on Us From the Sky: The True Story of Three Lost Boys from Sudan* will speak at the Avon High School Auditorium,

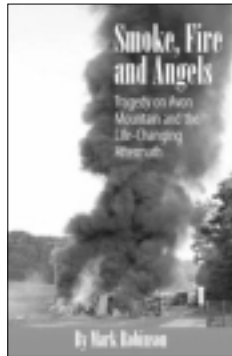

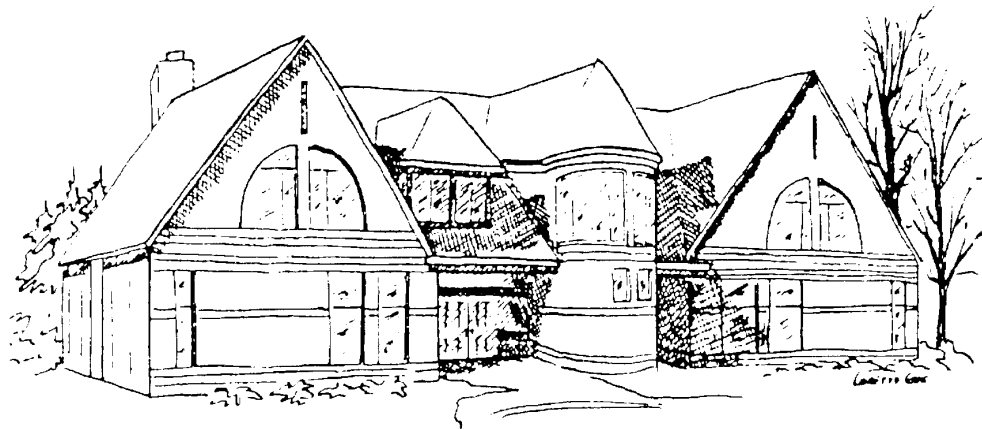
