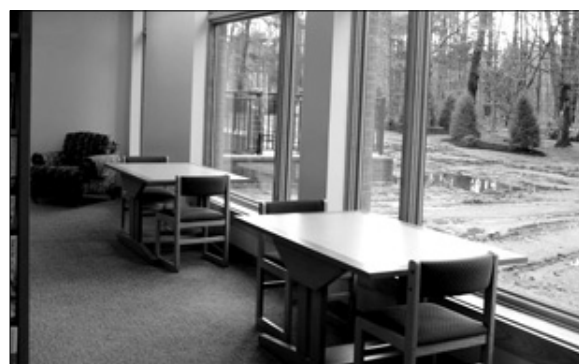

November 28 -- The library reopens on schedule!!!



Despite an unusually severe October storm that caused widespread delays throughout Avon, the Library reopened on schedule. With celebration and smiles, the library staff and *Friends'* volunteers welcomed residents into the new library space on Monday, November 28.



Expansion Update

Our patrons are delighted with the recent opening of the expanded portion of the library. With only a few months before the construction and renovation project is completed, the enthusiasm and excitement are palpable. We are planning to celebrate the project's completion with a Grand Opening ceremony and other related events later in the Spring of 2012.

Hundreds of donors have shown their support for the library with a donation to the capital campaign, which will enable us to provide a finished building that truly meets the expectations of our community. We have achieved the campaign goal of \$1 million, but additional funds are still needed. The first \$500,000 of funds raised has been committed to the Town of Avon, in order to contribute to the cost of the project. Additional capital campaign funds will be used to support enhancements to the building in technology, furniture, lighting, signage, electronic bulletin boards, self-check-out stations, programming and collection development. The fundraising effort will continue through the completion of the project, in order to equip the library with these enhancements and to endow a fund to support future needs. If you have not already contributed, don't miss the opportunity to be a part of this historic achievement. 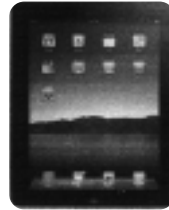
