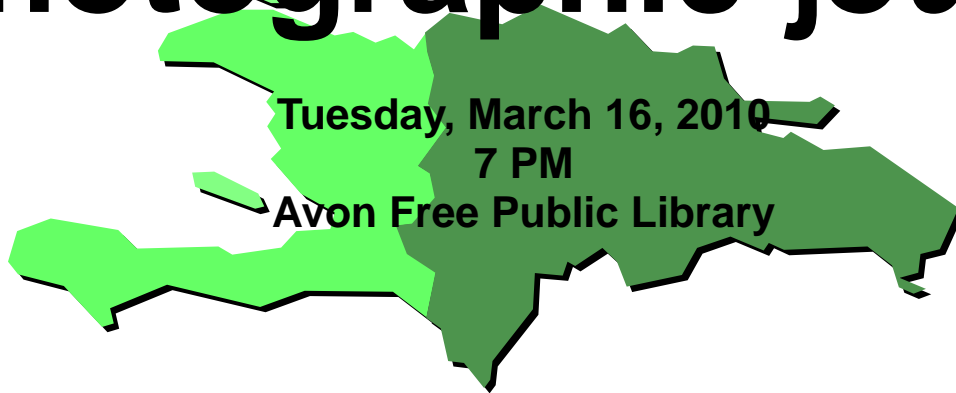


Haiti, before and after: a photographic journey

Marc Regis is the author of three books: "Haiti Through My Eyes," a selection of poetry about Haiti; "Deadly Road to Democracy," a first-person account of Haiti's violent struggle for democracy; and "Two Good Feet," a photographic documentary of physically-challenged Haitian children. Recently, Regis finished his latest book, "When Freedom Comes," a photographic documentation about the lives of Haitian braceros, or field hands, in the highly restrictive sugarcane plantations in the Dominican Republic. He is working on his next book, "Headstrong," a photographic essay of street entrepreneurs in Haiti.
