Expansion Update

At the October 4, 2007 meeting, the Avon Town Council appointed the Library Building Committee to begin the process of selecting an architect and planning for the library expansion. The Board of Directors is very grateful to the Town Council, the Town Manager and many others who have supported this project while successfully balancing other priorities for the town. The Board of Directors and the library staff have completed several key documents which will be instrumental in the building committee's work. They include the Avon Free Public Library Strategic Plan, the Technology Plan, the Library Building Program and the Statement of Need. Each of these documents serves a specific purpose in planning for a municipal project of this nature. They are available at the library for anyone who wishes to examine them. In addition, we have reviewed and revised, where necessary, several Board policies relating to finance and investments, insurance and operating procedures in order to ensure that we are well prepared for the challenges of the expansion and fundraising.

The Board expects to appoint several ad-hoc committees over the next year to support the library expansion and related communications and fundraising efforts. We want to bring together the best resources in town to assure that Avon residents are involved and well-informed on the library's expansion priorities and construction progress as the larger building takes shape. We appreciate all the interest and support you have demonstrated, which will assure that our future library is a great asset for all Avon people.

Library Fine Increase

An increase in the fine rate for overdue library materials went into effect November 1 as voted on by the Avon Library Board of Directors. Library users will be charged 15 cents per day per overdue item; the fine rate used to be 10 cents per day and had not been changed since 1995. Fine rates for videos and DVDs continue to be \$1.00 per day and \$10.00 per day for overdue museum passes. Overdue fines are levied by most public libraries as an incentive to return library materials. Collected fines are turned over to the Town of Avon Collector of Revenue, with the exception of videos and DVD revenue, which is used to purchase more DVDs.

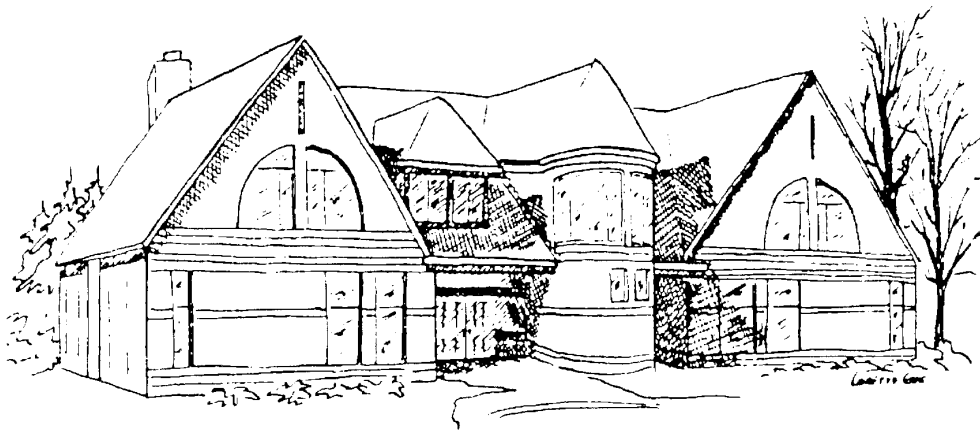
