

Lessons in Chemistry: Literature Lecture & Discussion with Dr. Aimee Pozorski

Join us for an **in-person** presentation and discussion on the ONLY book anyone has been reading for the past year - we literally cannot keep it on the shelf!

Lessons in Chemistry by Bonnie Garmus at first promises to be about the work of research scientist and chemist Elizabeth Zott. And it certainly is that! But the "lessons" in "chemistry" the novel promises go far beyond research. The novel's lessons may be chemical in nature but have as much to do with the chemistry of cooking, the chemistry of love and attraction, the chemistry of relationships, and the chemistry of societal change. The chemical attraction of this book can also be explained by the author's style: through humor, irony, sarcasm, and wit, Bonnie Garmus has created a novel that feels itself like an endorphin rush.



Courtyard Renovation

Avon Library's courtyard will be closed for the next several months for a renovation project. While we do not expect this work to impact normal library services, there may be some minor inconveniences during construction.

Demolition work on the existing courtyard was completed by Town Public Works staff, and contractors have begun work on the new courtyard.

The project is estimated to be complete in August, and the renovated courtyard will feature many improvements including better lighting, a pergola, improved drainage, and additional plantings. All donor bricks, purchased in support of the 2012 library renovation and expansion, will be reused in the new courtyard design. We look forward to inviting library users to enjoy this beautiful new outdoor space in late summer!


